Introduction

We already know that Jesus Christ is undoubtedly the way Home. He died to save us from sin and death, but let us not also forget that it is said in *1 Peter 2:24 (NKJV)*, “*who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by whose stripes you were healed.*”

Yes! Jesus Christ also died for our healing; the type of healing that covers you physically (diseases, illnesses, etc.), emotionally (sicknesses, traumas, heart breaks, etc.) and spiritually (sin and the powers of darkness). This is the type of healing necessary on your way Home.

By definition, healing is the process of restoring health, wholeness, or soundness to the body, mind, or spirit, often involving recovery from injury, disease, or emotional distress. It is a holistic transformation toward balance, not merely the absence of disease.

Healing is usually obvious when it comes to physical health; when we get sick, we immediately become aware that we need healing. However, there is a deeper aspect to healing than physical recovery. This kind of healing doesn't only heal you from ongoing sicknesses, illnesses and diseases, but it also heals you from further health complications. That is the type of healing that Jesus Christ wants for you.

To be honest, most of us believe that there is nothing wrong with ourselves, better yet, truth be told, we all think good of ourselves! However, when we read in *Isaiah 64:6 (NKJV)*, “*But we are all like an unclean thing, And all our righteousnesses are like filthy rags; We all fade as a leaf, And our iniquities, like the wind, Have taken us away.*”

When we read this passage, we awaken to the reality that none of us can claim to be good in God's Eyes.

In spiritual terms, we are all corrupt, guilty of sin and therefore we are all sick. There is no way around it! Through sin we opened ourselves up to the powers of darkness, and in return they (the power of darkness) get to steal our health; that is what they do as Jesus Christ said in *John 10:10 (NKJV)*, "*The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.*"

Through sin, we give access to the powers of darkness, and they will undoubtedly steal our health as an attempt to kill us.

The process of getting sick is quite simple. All it takes is for them (the powers of darkness) to place a virus or a bacteria somewhere they don't belong and once the pathogens get to your system, it's a wrap, you are infected! Or, they can put you under heavy stress or depression, disturb your sleep, and do much more. At the end, before you know it, your health is deteriorating and your body is in a state of disease.

A quick glance at today's society would testify of how desperately we all need true healing. We all need to heal from the sickness of sin! However, how can we heal if we don't believe that we are sick in the first place? How can you tell someone who is physically fit that they need healing? Worse yet, how can you show the world that what is manifested physically must be dealt with spiritually? You can't! Faith is the only way to explain because the healing process here is so different from the physical process that it cannot be separated from your relationship with Jesus Christ! It is impossible! They both go hand in hand and they complement one another on the same journey!

Certainly, healing is a journey; it is a journey deep within the heart; to see the true reflection of self in God's mirror; in order to dig out the buried bones, so to speak, and to address the wounds, the bad and the ugly.

Again, the healing journey must be taken alongside Jesus Christ, because He is the One Who will hold your hand, reassure you, protect you, help you and heal you along the journey.

Nonetheless, just like any other journey that requires a starting point, healing must also start from somewhere, and since home is where the heart is, the best place to start should be home (your heart along with how you grew up). Do you get the irony here? You must start from home in order to go Home.

In other words, you must start from your heart, the damaged foundation (from what has been done to you and from how you were raised at home) before addressing any other issues, because that is where everything sprouted from; the wounds, the hurts, the traumas, the bad habits and all of the above. As a result, if you can heal your broken heart/home by shifting your home to Home (Jesus Christ), you will be able to heal your entire being, it is like a snow ball effect.

So, let us not stall any further with vain speculation, but rather, let us proceed onto our journey at once!

Chapter I

The Wounds

The wounds refer to what has been done to you; the hurt, the traumas and so on; which all began at home.

The Bible says in *Ephesians 6:4 (NKJV)*, "*And you, fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord.*"

Notice how the scripture covers the three dimensional responsibility of a father; physically, emotionally and spiritually.

The physical aspect is to be physically present, to provide shelter, protection, and basic necessities required to raise the child.

The emotional aspect is to be emotionally present; to care, to express, and to provide an emotionally safe environment. This would allow the child to express their emotions so that they are not provoked to wrath.

The spiritual aspect is to stand and to intercede for the child; to pray for them, anoint them, bless them, and teach them in regard to raising them in the admonition of the Lord.

As a man/father/husband you are to reflect the love of The Heavenly Father to your household especially to your child. Failing to be present in the child's life in any of the three dimensional aspects (physically, emotionally or spiritually), will cause the child suffer a wound.

The physical absence of a father puts the child in position to lack protection, provision, discipline, authority and much more. The emotional absence of a father puts the child in position to suffer guilt,

shame, lack of self-confidence, traumas and much more. The spiritual absence of a father puts the child in position to be opened to the powers of darkness, which can result in immorality, sorcery, addiction, witchcraft and much more.

Even the wife is not spared from the consequences of a failing husband. As a matter of fact it is said in *Ephesians 5:25 (NKJV)*, *"Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her,"*

Lacking proper leadership as a man will also expose the wife/mother to emotional, physical and spiritual wounds. She will suffer from the husband's lack of leadership as much as the children. As a result the child will be prone to miss the mother's love all together, because she didn't receive the proper support from the father/husband.

The picture to paint here is to see the father/husband being supported by Jesus Christ, and then in return the father/husband supports the mother/wife who then supports the children.

Take out Jesus Christ as the foundation and the home will crumble. In the same manner, take out the father/husband and the woman will suffer along with the children.

Now, apply the picture to the home where you grew up, eventually you will realize the damage that has been done to you.

None of our parents were perfect! They did their best with what they had. Nonetheless, one way or another, we were wounded; not to mention the injustice and ruthlessness of the world out there.

However, that we were wounded is not the end of the world. Indeed, our parents might have fumbled, but we can still make it right, because Jesus Christ made a way for us to heal from all of this.

Through spiritual healing aka deliverance and developing a relationship with Jesus Christ, the entire healing process can come together. The authority in the Name of Jesus is mighty indeed to set you free from the powers of darkness. The Love of The Father is

powerful enough to heal your soul, and Holy Spirit is strong enough to nurture you back to life and to help you maintain your health.

In sum, seeing that God created your body to heal itself, all you will need is a sound spirit accompanied by an emotionally balanced soul, and your body will be able to recover from all the tragedies.

The Love of a Father

So, in case you missed on your father's love and blessings, I, as a pastor and father, will bestow the blessings of a father on you. This is the same blessing that God commanded the priest to bless His people with in *Numbers 6:24-26 (NKJV)*; here, I impart my blessing over you and your posterity.

The Lord bless you and keep you;

The Lord make His face shine upon you, And be gracious to you;

The Lord lift up His countenance upon you, And give you peace.

The Love of a Mother

God created the woman/mothers to reflect the Love of Holy Spirit; the kind of Love that nurtures, helps, and is always there for you, no matter what. As a result, when a child fails to experience the love of a mother, they also fail to be introduced to Holy Spirit. Consequently, they wander in despair, always looking for the nurturing kind of love.

This is where, once the boy becomes of age, he gets attracted to older women, because he yearns to be nurtured. Meanwhile, the young girl would fail to know how to be a woman; she will be plagued with insecurity, low self-esteem, and so on, because she lacked the nurturing love of her mother to teach her about womanhood and motherhood.

These are only examples of how the lack of a mother's love can impact a child. Not to mention that their spouse would suffer from that lack as well, because the nurturing nature of a woman is what makes a house a home. Therefore, the consequences of failing to demonstrate the love of a mother can be devastating to the household altogether.

Either way, the lack of love from either parent (father or mother) will result in a broken home, and since home is the foundation of society, the devastation of the home gets passed onto society. Thus, here

we are with broken men raised from broken homes, and as a result the broken men come together to form a broken society. A corrupt and broken world caught in a vicious cycle, bound to repeat the same devastating mistakes. Lord have mercy! Our only hope is to return to God, Jesus Christ.

Remember that Jesus Christ referred to Holy Spirit as The Helper in *John 14:26 (NKJV)*, *"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you."*

Holy Spirit is still there, able to nurture, and to help us heal from the wound of lacking the love of a mother. So, let's run back to Him while we still can.

The Love of a Companion

We were not created to be alone. As a matter of fact, it is said in *Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 (NKJV)*, *"Two are better than one, Because they have a good reward for their labor. For if they fall, one will lift up his companion. But woe to him who is alone when he falls, For he has no one to help him up."*

We are social beings, we were not created to be alone therefore loneliness is something that we were not meant for.

Now, remember that being lonely is not about being alone or being in solitude. No! Loneliness is simply being in absence of a companion.

You can be in a house full of people, but if you have no one that cares or connects with you, you are going to be lonely.

We all yearn for the love of a companion; a friend that is always there. Someone that can connect and understand us, in sum someone that we can laugh and cry with without prejudice.

Sometimes, we can find that friend in a brother/sister or parent, but most of the time we find them in a spouse.

However what happens when that friend moves on or worse case scenario, they pass away. This can be very devastating. Nonetheless there is a reason why God would allow this to happen; and one of the main reasons for that matter is for us to realize that that companionship (down here) was only meant to be temporary and to reflect the eternal companionship with Jesus Christ, because Christ is the true eternal companion that matches you in every way; He is the only one that truly fulfills you.

That you need Him as a savior on earth is only the beginning. In Heaven He is the companion that you desperately need to enjoy eternity with. Hence we are His bride and He demonstrated the greatest love for us as mentioned in *John 15:13 (NKJV)*, "*Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends.*"

In return, we are also called to exercise that same love for Jesus Christ, by denying ourselves daily; by killing the flesh over the spirit. This is not to negate the importance of the earthly companionship because that is where our love starts, with our neighbor; to love our neighbor as we love ourselves as mentioned in *Luke 10:27 (NKJV)*, "*So he answered and said, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind,' and 'your neighbor as yourself.'*"

Breaking Spoken Curses

In life, whether conscious or not, we have spoken curses over someone's life and vice-versa, someone, or worse yet, a parent or a brother have spoken a curse over our lives.

Let us not forget that life and death are in the power of the tongue as mentioned in *Proverbs 18:21 (NKJV)*, "*Death and life are in the power of the tongue, And those who love it will eat its fruit.*"

Even though the Blood of Jesus Christ can and will cover you by default, when we, including our bloodline, get consciously entangled with the enemy, the responsibility falls on us to break the legal rights tied to the powers of darkness. As a result, we need to be very careful on how we use our words and also be quick to discern and to cancel when someone speaks a curse over our lives. By failing to destroy these curses over our lives, we stand in agreement with them and therefore allowing the curses to land and to take effect in our lives.

Remember that the enemy is also called the accuser according to *Revelation 12:10-12 (NKJV)*, "*Then I heard a loud voice saying in heaven, "Now salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of His Christ have come, for the accuser of our brethren, who accused them before our God day and night, has been cast down. And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, and they did not love their lives to the death. Therefore rejoice, O heavens, and you who dwell in them! Woe to the inhabitants of the earth and the sea! For the devil has come down to you, having great wrath, because he knows that he has a short time."*

By failing to revoke any access of the enemy to your life, the enemy accuses you by default of consenting to his doings; but praise God for the authority given to us in the Name of Jesus Christ, we can cancel and destroy all of the enemy's curses and rights in the Name of Jesus Christ.

We renounce the kingdom of darkness and say yes to You, Father God, Lord Jesus Christ and Holy Spirit. We say yes to the Kingdom of Light. We implore You to please forgive our sins, as we also forgive ourselves, our parents, our grandparents, our bloodlines, and all those who have offended us in any way.

We pray that you forgive us for speaking curses over one another's life and we thank You for saving us from these curses.

With the power and authority given to us in the Name of Jesus Christ, we cancel and destroy every spoken curse over our lives. We also cancel and destroy every curse that we have spoken over someone else's life in the Name of Jesus Christ.

Whether conscious or unconscious, intentionally or unintentionally; whether from mother, father, brother, sister, stranger or from ourselves, we cancel and destroy them all in the Name of Jesus Christ.

We cancel and destroy every word or action intending to sabotage or to hinder our blessings, success and prosperity in the Name of Jesus Christ.

Holy Spirit, we thank you for helping us discern and to uncover in the future, every curse spoken over our lives and to quickly destroy them in The Name of Jesus Christ.

We declare and proclaim that we are blessed, successful and prosperous in the Name of Jesus Christ.

Father, we thank You, we love You, we adore You, and we have prayed in the Name of Jesus Christ.

Amen!

Chapter II

Facing The Ugly

In God's mirror, it is always easier to face the wounds than to deal with the ugly; it is always easy to play the victim. Facing the ugly is a part that we tend to avoid like a plague, because it exposes our true hurt and where we played the villain in other peoples' stories. The selfish behavior, the verbal and emotional pain we've caused to others because we were hurting, the narcissistic behavior, the addiction, and so on.

Yes, you were hurting and were ignorant of the pain you were causing on others. Nonetheless, it doesn't make it right! Just because you are hurting doesn't give you the right to hurt others. Isn't this what Jesus Christ said in *Matthew 5:39-42 (NKJV)*, "*But I tell you not to resist an evil person. But whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also. If anyone wants to sue you and take away your tunic, let him have your cloak also. And whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two. Give to him who asks you, and from him who wants to borrow from you do not turn away.*"

By forgiving and turning the other cheek, you are preventing the pain to spread. However, it takes a double dose of pain in order to stop the pain from spreading. First you must endure the pain of being hurt, then endure the pain of forgiving. This is hard to do but not impossible, nonetheless.

This process begins to make sense when you realize that you're not innocent yourself and that you also victimized others in the process.

This doesn't mean that you deserve to be punished, no! This is to say that you need to forgive others because you need to be forgiven yourself!

As you wake up to that reality, you begin to repent and pray for change; that God helps you change.

Unless you come to your senses to take responsibility of your wrong doings, your healing is only going to be partial.

Remember that Jesus Christ wants it all: wounds, bad and ugly! He wants to heal them all! God wants to change your heart as mentioned in *Ezekiel 36:26-27 (NKJV)*, "*I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; I will take the heart of stone out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. I will put My Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes, and you will keep My judgments and do them.*"

In fact, it goes without saying that in facing the ugly, you will need forgiveness and repentance.

Therefore, let's take a look at your closet and let's ask for forgiveness. Shall we?

Consider what you have done to others. Recount the moments when you were mean, greedy, or flat out fought back out of rage; open up your closet and bring out the skeletons in front of God. Then admit that you were a villain in someone else's story and did evil as well. Own up to the ugly that you did and ask God for forgiveness. Then receive God forgiveness, knowing that He knew it all, seen it all and atoned for it all at the cross.

All along, remember to allow yourself to go through the emotions of it all, because the enemy will try to use guilt and shame to prevent you from getting to God. So, let the tears flow, embrace God's grace and mercy and believe that He truly forgives you.

Now that you have experience true forgiveness, do the same for the villains in your life; forgive them and forget what they did to you just like Jesus Christ did for you. Keep in mind, that forgiveness does not mean reconciliation, no! Rather that you release them to God and

that you let God deal with them. What they did to you as well as what you did to others is not for us to hold against one other, no; it is so we can learn how to better treat one another.

Remember that it is said in *Proverbs 15:9 (NKJV)*, "*The way of the wicked is an abomination to the Lord, But He loves him who follows righteousness.*"

God is not asking for perfection! He is asking willingness to pursue righteousness. That's all!

Chapter III
